

Installation

This is the same procedure you'll use for Interface files, Curriculum files, or Supplement files.

Creating the Tapestry of Grace folder

If you haven't created a Tapestry of Grace folder, make one now.

1. In the Finder, go to File → New Finder Window (or press ⌘-N) to open a new Finder Window.
2. Click on Applications.
3. Go to File → New Folder (or press Shift-⌘-N) to create a new folder. Name the folder "Tapestry of Grace." All of your Tapestry downloads that you purchase from the store or upgrade from the website will go into this directory.

Copying the files

When you opened the .dmg file, there was a folder and this file. Drag that folder inside your Tapestry of Grace folder.

Starting Tapestry DE

To open Tapestry DE documents (like your week-plans and supplements), you will need to use LockLizard Safeguard Viewer and have a LockLizard license. Go to <http://puzzle.tapestryofgrace.com> for more information about the pieces in the Tapestry DE puzzle.

Running from the Applications folder

1. In the Finder, go to File → New Finder Window (or press ⌘-N) to open a new Finder Window.
2. Click on Applications.
3. Double-click your Tapestry of Grace folder.
4. Inside your Interface folder for your year-plan, double-click the index.htm file to see the main interface page.

Creating a desktop icon

1. In the Finder, go to File → New Finder Window (or press ⌘-N) to open a new Finder Window.
2. Click on Applications.
3. Double-click your Tapestry of Grace folder.
4. Inside your Interface folder for your year-plan, right-click (or Control-click) the index.htm file and select “Make Alias.” That will create a new icon called “index.htm alias.” Move that alias icon to the desktop.
5. Click the desktop alias icon once to select it. Then click the text underneath it that says “index.htm alias” and change it to “Year x Tapestry DE” (where x is the year-plan) and press Return.

Making your desktop icon have a Tapestry logo (optional)

1. Finder → Applications → Tapestry of Grace → Interface_Yx → images
2. Right click the cov1.jpg file and select Get info.
3. Double-click the Preview image. That will open another window.
4. Select the image with the select tool.
5. Edit → Copy or press ⌘-C.
6. Select the alias from on your desktop and File → Get Info or ⌘-I.
7. Click the small icon in the upper left corner of that window (not the large preview icon).
8. Edit > Paste or ⌘-V to replace the icon.
